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# Delving Into Existential Fatigue and The Search for Meaning in The Play "kapai-kapai" by Arifin C. Noer

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#### ABSTRACT

**Background.** The script of the play "Kapai-Kapai" by Arifin C. Noer has long been the subject of discussion in the Indonesian theater world because of its ability to depict existential fatigue and the search for meaning in human life.

One of the drama scripts that has become the center of attention in Indonesian theater discussions is "Kapai-Kapai" by Arifin C. Noer. Since it was first staged, this script has invited various interpretations and reflections on the themes raised, as well as a unique writing style. This is because the thinking given by Arifin C. Noer tends to be different from most other writers, writing with a philosophical pattern gives its own color in his works.

Meanwhile, sugiyono (The qualitative analysis method was chosen because it gave the opportunity for the author to analyze the manuscript with a broad perspective so as to produce a broad discussion. This method also gives the author the opportunity to explore themes, characters and various intrinsic elements, thus producing in-depth discussions that are not only oriented to the script but also to objects outside the script such as social life, culture and so on (Archard, 2023; Bakken, 2023).

After the interpretation process is complete, the author will try to rearrange all the interpretations that have been obtained to produce a discussion that is comprehensive, structured and understandable by the reader.

The script "Kapai-Kapai" raises the main theme of existential fatigue and the search for meaning in life. Arifin C. Noer uses characters in the script to describe the despair and confusion experienced by individuals who feel trapped in an aimless routine.

**Existential Fatigue:** This theme is shown through the character Abu who feels tired of his monotonous life. Abu often expressed his despair towards the life he was living without a clear direction. The dialogues are full of complaints about uncertainty and boredom, reflecting feelings experienced by many individuals in modern society. This can be seen through the behavior of abu who always complains to his mother as a parent. In addition, this existential fatigue can also be seen from the dialogue between Abu and Iyem when they want to deceive their young children. Here's the dialogue:

Abu : Kita harus tahan. Setidaknya satu hari lagi anggap saja puasa.

Iyem : Ini hari kelima. Lapar. Lapar. Lapar. Lapar.

Abu : Jangan hitung. Iyem : Kita bunuh saja.

This existential fatigue can also be seen from how Abu always gets pressure from his employer who always speaks rudely and without mercy.

Majikan : Abu ! Abu ! Abu : (DIAM) Majikan : Anjing !

Abu : (MERANGKAK) Ya, Tuan.

Majikan : Anjing! Abu : Ya, Tuan. Majikan : Anjing!

The Search for Meaning in Life: Ash, on the other hand, continues to search for the meaning of life through a variety of means, including interactions with other characters and spiritual quests. His quest describes the human desire to find purpose and meaning in their lives, although it often ends in confusion and disappointment. This can be seen from his dialogue with the group leaders heading to the Sulaiman shop;

Abu : Ke toko Nabi Sulaiman.

Semua : Buat apa?

Abu : Untuk membebaskan kita dari kutuk ini.

Semua : Bahagia.

*Abu* : Ya itu nama khasiatnya.

# **Character Development**

The characters in "Kapai-Kapai" are carefully developed to describe the themes raised.

Ash: This character is portrayed as an individual who is stuck in a daily routine with no hope for change. Ash is the personification of existential fatigue, with dialogues that show his boredom and despair towards life.

Iyem: Iyem is a more dynamic character and is constantly trying to find meaning in life. His internal conflicts and interactions with other characters reflect the struggle of man in finding a purpose in life in the midst of uncertainty.

This can be seen from how the plot that leads each character into the atmosphere, the plot and disposition that continues to be developed into an interesting narrative.

# Writing Style of Arifin C. Noer

Arifin C. Noer uses a strong and symbolic writing style in "Kapai-Kapai."

Dialogue and Monologue: The use of dialogue and monologues in this script is very effective in conveying the feelings and thoughts of the characters. The dialogues are often reflective and full of existential questions, while monologues are used to express the characters' deepest feelings.

Symbolism: This manuscript is loaded with symbolism, the most prominent of which is the mirror of deception in this manuscript. The mirror in this manuscript symbolizes a journey of life full of uncertainty and the search for meaning. The use of these symbols reinforces the themes raised and gives an additional layer of meaning to the story.
